

Hilarious new picture book for kids who hate cleaning their teeth!

Cazzie Phillips' début picture book, *The Rotters*, is a hilarious and inspiring way for primary school children to learn about the importance of dental hygiene as they follow a little boy's adventures with the grim and grizzly Rotters in their Sugar Lair.

The story was inspired by the author's youngest son who went through a phase of not wanting to clean his teeth.

"One evening I was tearing my hair out, and made up a story about a boy who would lose his teeth if he didn't start brushing them. Visualising the genuine danger of tooth decay as a bunch of grime-loving gangsters instantly got his attention."

Tooth decay is the most common reason for hospital admissions in children aged between 6 and 10-years-old², and one in four children are having teeth extracted before they reach five³. Twenty-first century high sugar diets are largely blamed for the crisis in children's dental health. Oral health experts globally agree that prevention through education is the way forward, with simple habits such as brushing twice a day and reducing sugar intake making a significant difference.

- In 2020, the UK government added oral hygiene to the National Curriculum⁴
- Public Health England's Changes4Life campaign⁵ encourages swapping sugary food and drinks for healthier alternatives and using fluoride toothpaste
- The World Health Organisation has just launched a Global Oral Health Action Plan, developed over 3 years, with measurable targets set for 2030⁶

The Rotters' charmingly wily gangsters were inspired by Cazzie's research on how oral bacteria causes tooth decay.

"I wanted to understand how these microorganisms worked. I got stuck into dental papers and journals, and found magnified images of how the main culprits of tooth decay operated. It was fascinating to see these tiny creatures at work, their distinct shapes and movements, and the order in which the various bacterial strains gang up on our teeth."

With the author's background in journalism and marketing rather than dentistry, Cazzie turned to a senior dental professional to fact-check the story. John Grummitt⁷ was also the founder of a popular dental practice in Nottingham and often visited schools armed with 'limited educational resources about dental health'. John loved the story, and described it as 'the best dental health book for younger patients' he had seen.

The book's stunning artwork has been produced by Agnès Ernoult, whose other recent work, *Le Roi Kipu* (The Smelly King), is currently enjoying success in the Top 40 independent book seller's list in France⁸. For *The Rotters*, Agnès was pleased to have a chance to imagine characters that were a bit different to the average children's book.

"Nowadays, it seems that many publishers like to keep things smooth, not too messy, not too weird, maybe to make sure their books will be liked by the greatest number of people. As an illustrator and a big fan of children's books, I think it's necessary to have some ugly, funny, dirty characters in the kid-lit scene, partly because it's a healthy way to discover the many characters that exist in this world, partly because...well, because it's fun!"
